MEET MONDAY, JULY 26 AT 8:00 A.M. IN FLC PARKING LOT

Meet in the FLC parking lot beside the FLC main entrance. PARENTS ARE REQUIRED TO COME INTO FLC FOYER TO CHECK STUDENT IN! PLEASE DO NOT DROP YOUR STUDENT OFF! It is a must that everyone is on time because we have a strict schedule!! **PLEASE EAT BREAKFAST BEFORE YOU COME...** WE WILL NOT BE STOPPING FOR BREAKFAST, BUT WE WILL STOP FOR LUNCH.

LUGGAGE: Each person must be able to carry all of their luggage. Please pack accordingly. There will be a lot of walking and possibly climbing stairs once we arrive, so you want to pack efficiently!

RETURN FRIDAY, JULY 30 AT 3:00 P.M.

We will return to FLC parking lot approximately 3:00 p.m. Many factors can affect this target time. Call 979-297-2498 ext. 17 for updates to this exact time. Please be there when we arrive.

WHAT TO BRING:

1. **\$10 Refundable Key Deposit – Students will INDIVIDUALLY pay a deposit at registration. Exact bills are required.**
2. Cash for 2 meals to and from camp (please eat breakfast before you come on Monday!)
3. Spending money for souvenirs, snacks, t-shirts, CDs
4. A pair of close-toed shoes
5. Clothes for two days of recreation that can get extremely dirty, including a dark-colored t-shirt for water games (only one-piece swimsuits)
6. Casual clothing for four days (shorts and pants are acceptable for all meetings including worship)
7. Sheets, a blanket, a pillow, sleeping bag, etc.
8. Toiletries (travel size please)
9. Soap, Towels and wash rags for 4 nights
10. Bible, pen, notebook, etc.
11. Alarm Clock / Watch
12. Swimsuit and towel. No two-pieces, tankinis, or Speedos. Cover-ups must be worn over swimsuits when going to and from swim areas.
13. Modest Shorts (at an absolute MINIMUM of 4 inch inseam - Sponsors reserve right to instruct students to change using their judgment even if the inseam meets this inseam requirement)
14. Modest Shirts (no spaghetti straps or tank tops – sleeveless is OK if modest; no questionable logos or sayings)
15. Jeans
16. Sleepwear
17. Socks/Underwear
18. Athletic shoes / EXTRA PAIR for recreation!
19. Camera
20. Remember to write name on all belongings!

WHAT NOT TO BRING:

1. 2-piece swimsuit
2. Short Shorts (at an absolute MINIMUM of 4 inch inseam - Sponsors reserve right to instruct students to change using their judgment even if the inseam meets this inseam requirement) Don't test us on this.
3. Tight clothing
4. Spaghetti Strap Shirts or tank tops or See-through clothing
5. Drugs/Alcohol, Fireworks, Tobacco
6. Laser pens, Water balloons
7. Clothing with questionable sayings, slogan, etc.
8. **Cell phones, iPods, mp3 players or video games (NEW STUDENT LIFE RULE!)**
9. Walkman/Jam Boxes/Mini Players of any kind/lap tops
10. Weapons of any kind – that includes knives of any kind
11. Secular magazines/books
12. Bad Attitudes

GUIDELINES

1. Everyone is expected to observe the highest standards of Christian conduct at all times
2. No girls are allowed in guys' room or guys allowed in girls' rooms.
3. For safety, a sponsor must always know where you are.
4. Be aware that you are personally responsible for all damages to all facilities including dorm rooms.
5. If damage occurs, disciplinary action will be taken, and your church will be billed immediately.
6. No food or drinks in the auditorium and meeting rooms.
7. No shaving cream, food, water fights, raids, or rough play in the buildings. **You are financially responsible for any and all damage to the property or the bus!**
8. Please review the What Not to Bring List. We reserve the right to inspect luggage should we have reason to do so.
9. Attention Sweethearts! No muggin'. No kissing, no holding hands and no caressing. Hands off! Simply NO PDA (public display of affection). Keep your bod for God!
10. During bus rides after the sun goes down, guys will be on one side of the bus and girls on the other. No guys and girls riding beside one another.
11. No two-pieces, tankinis, or Speedos. Cover-ups must be worn over swimsuits when going to and from swim areas.
12. Everyone is expected to attend all meetings. This means that everyone should be doing what everyone is doing.
13. Do not leave the campus. Do not go hiking.

*Anyone who chooses not to obey the established guidelines will be subject to the following disciplinary process:

LEVEL ONE: Minor offenses will be dealt with by using encouragement, accountability and correction given to the students.

LEVEL TWO: Repeated minor offenses and more serious offenses may result in loss of free time, work opportunities, and/or special attractions.

LEVEL THREE: Repeated serious offenses may result in being sent home by bus or airplane at the student's/parents'/guardians' expense.

Things We Have an Understanding About

Dress Appropriately

At camp we are all a part of an environment where we are trying to remove distractions so that we can concentrate on what God wants to do in our lives. Don't be a distraction by dressing inappropriately. Should you choose to draw attention to yourself by dressing inappropriately, you will be asked by a staff member to change clothes.

Damages

Be aware that you are personally responsible for all damages to any facilities including dorm rooms. If damages occur, disciplinary action will be taken, and your church will be billed immediately. No food or drinks in the auditorium and meeting rooms.

Campus

Everyone is expected to attend all meetings. This means that everyone should be doing what everyone else is doing. Do not leave the campus. "Lights out" means that all students should be in their rooms and lights should be out. **NO GUYS** in girls dorms or rooms. **NO GIRLS** in guys dorms or rooms.

Student Involvement

In our continuing effort to provide you and your students with the best camp experience, we have made adjustments to our opportunities for student involvement. This year we are replacing our typical student involvement meeting with a number of tracks being held during free time, in which students can participate. The opportunity for your students to be involved in our corporate time still exists. However, they will be pulled from these track times. Some of those who attend our drama track will be able to participate as extras in our dramas, including a few speaking roles. Those with musical interests will be able to participate in our student choir that will lead in worship one evening. There could also be opportunities for Scripture reading, praying and sharing testimonies for those interested who attend some of the other tracks.
